

THE HUMAN MIND, LIMITS AND INFINITE PERSPECTIVES IN KNOWLEDGE

Associate Prof. PhD. Gina Luminiţa SCARLAT, Dunărea de Jos University, Galati, Romania

Abstract

The human mind is the subject of research for various fields of activity. Socio-human research fields investigate the brain's relationship with the mind, its circumstantial and relational functionality, the biological support and the complex processes of the soul, the principles of its formation and the relationship with consciousness, as well as its mode of action at the level of the human communities. Besides these perspectives, there is a special domain of mind research: that of Christian patristic spirituality. But what are the research objectives of Christian spirituality with regard to the human mind? And why did the uman mind come to the attention of the holy Fathers of the Church? From the texts of Christian anthropology and spirituality it follows that the mind has become a subject of research because the most intimate union between man and God is at its level.

ON THE BORDERLINE BETWEEN SOCIAL, EDUCATION AND KNOWLEDGE IN ROMANIAN INTERWAR SOCIETY

Associate Prof. PhD. Ovidiu Dănuţ Soare, Dunărea de Jos University, Galati, Romania

Abstract

During the Romanian interwar period, families who did not send their children to school were fined. In most cases, the fines were cancelled for various reasons such as the lack of communication, the families' low income or if the children returned to school as soon as possible. This process was a thorough one, involving several institutions, which means that education was taken seriously by the state institutions, such as the School, the Church and the Family. This article showcases aspects of education in rural areas in a rather tense period in Europe. An economically poor interwar rural environment, on the borderline between education and knowledge, aware of the importance of a good education, which was as important as caring for a medically healthy society or caring for a society well-prepared for foreign aggression.



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PHILOSOPHY OF INTERDISCIPLINARITY

Associate Prof. PhD. Curis Cecilia, Dunărea de Jos University, Galati, Romania

Abstract

The interdisciplinary approach in science is becoming more widespread today. It is gratifying that in the age of applied sciences, in which technology prevails, philosophy as the core of the humanities is restored to its status. Starting from the definition of philosophy that includes notions such as knowledge, values, reason, existence, mind, language, it is not surprising the attitude of modern man in relation to the rational approach of including this fundamental discipline in scientific research in any field. This reconceptualization is absolutely necessary for the progress of humanity starting from the assumption that no field of scientific research can exist without a series of methodological principles. Consequently, we can consider philosophy, the theoretical foundation of any science and more than that, a science applied, per se with resonance in everyday existence. What can be more important for the human being than explaining the meaning of life, the relationship with peers and the psychological motivation of its existence in this world? Thus, philosophy can be the promoter of the active attitude of the individual in any social field. It is important to consider the model of the individual who from a moral point of view is interested, participatory, has a purpose and correctly defines his duties towards himself and society. These coordinates define the pattern of the human being capable of participating in the progress of humanity.

CLASSICISM AND NEO-CLASSICISMS IN THE HISTORY OF MUSIC

Associate Prof. PhD. Gabriel Bulancea,

University "Dunărea de Jos", Domnească Street no. 47, Galați, Romania,

Abstract

In one of his articles, Octavian Paler draws attention in a metaphorical-mythologizing manner upon one of the risks taken by those who chose tradition as their source of inspiration. The epigonic spirit, because this is what he refers to, cannot escape idolatrising tradition, phenomenon that happens within an alterity of the creative identity, within the pettiness of controlling the artistic means, within the infatuation of his own image which is placed under the protection of the great creative figures. The epigone masters in an embryonic form some techniques which, for various reasons, he cannot manipulate creatively. He is somehow suspended between two sensibilities, hence his failure. On the one hand, he is not aware of the risk of assuming past sensibilities, and on the other, he does not assume his contemporariness. Giving in to the temptation of looking too much into the past, the epigonic artist loses his identifying sensibility.

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WHAT MAKES A SUCCESSFUL DIPLOMA THEATRE SHOW?

Associate Prof. PhD. Toma Florin, Dunărea de Jos University, Galati, Romania

Abstract

This study aims to answer some questions related to the principles, rules, tools, and methods to be employed when working on a show to be performed in theatre schools, as opposed to performances in institutions. What are the requirements for such a goal? What comes first: pedagogical or artistic approaches? What are the criteria that should be used when choosing a dramatic text? Is there a clash between the objectives of a study program and the constraints of theatre performances or can they harmoniously complete each other? How can we draw the line between teaching and acting? What is a successful diploma theatre show? What is the relation between pedagogy and direction and how do they blend when putting a performance in place? What boundaries are to be crossed to make the transition from mere student to professional actor? These are only some of the questions that this study shall endeavour to answer, viewed especially from the perspective of the correlation between educational request and market demand, a lively subject of debate in contemporary society.

He was a visiting lecturer in UC Davis, U. Bordeaux III, U.Lille III, Buddhist Center at Pidurangala Sri Lanka, U. Perpignan at Mende, U. Paris II Panthéon Assas, U. Paris I Panthéon Sorbonne, U. Paris Dauphine, U. Versailles Saint Quentin en Yvelines at Mantes la Jolie, U. Paris VIII Vincennes Saint Denis. He holds two PhD in Germanic linguistics and in Didactics of Foreign Languages. Dr. Andreas May was professor at the Saint Louis University - Madrid campus and authored numerous publications on geological and palaeontological topics. Now he works as a computer scientist in a large German company. He is a database expert and a scientist. Almost all of my publications are on palaeontology (Devonian corals, stromatoporoids, brachiopods and reefs) and geology (microfacies of limestone, weathering durability of building Stone, Devonian stratigraphy and extinction events).

From 1982 to 1991 Dr. Andreas May studied geology and palaeontology at the universities of Bochum and Münster in Germany. From 2002 to 2005 he was Professor for Earth Sciences, Environmental Sciences, Evolutionary Biology and Palaeontology at the Saint Louis University - Madrid campus. He wrote or contributed to more than 90 publications on palaeontology and/or geology. Now he is married, has four children and is working as a Senior Database Developer in Germany. Since 2017 he is writing a book on Christianity, evolution and related topics in German language as well as in Spanish language.
